



Olivier GUERSENT

Olivier Guersent is Director-General of the DG Competition since 1st January 2020. He joined the European Commission in 1992, initially with the "Merger Task Force" in DG Competition. Since then, he has alternated between the cabinets of European Competition Commissioners (Karel Van Miert and Neelie Kroes) and DG Competition (notably as Head of Unit in charge of policy and coordination of cases, Head of Unit in charge of merger control and, from 2009, as Director responsible for the fight against cartels). From 2010 to 2014 he was the head of cabinet of Michel Barnier, Commissioner for Internal Market and Services. Olivier Guersent was Director-

General of the Directorate-General for Financial Stability, Financial Services and Capital Markets Union (2015 – 2019).



Tomaso DUSO

Tomaso Duso is the chairman of the German Monopolies Commission. He is a professor of empirical industrial economics at the Technische Universität (TU) Berlin and the Head of the Firms and Markets Department at the Deutsches Institut für Wirtschaftsforschung (DIW Berlin). He is a member of the Economic Advisory Group on Competition Policy (EAGCP) of the European Commission, and a Research Fellow for the CEPR and CESifo. Tomaso holds a PhD in Economics from the Humboldt University Berlin. He has advised several public bodies, such the

European Commission, the UK Competition and Markets Authority, the Dutch Authority for Consumers and Markets, the OECD and the EBRD.



Inge BERNAERTS

Inge Bernaerts is Director for Strategy and Policy in the Competition Directorate General of the European Commission. Previously, Inge held management positions in the Energy Directorate General of the Commission and was Head of Cabinet to Marianne Thyssen, Commissioner for Employment, Social Affairs, Skills and Labour Mobility in the Juncker Commission. She joined DG Competition in 2003. Before that, she practiced competition law at the Brussels bar and lectured

European law seminars at the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven.



Vincent VEROUDEN

Vincent Verouden is a Senior Economist at the European Commission (DG Competition), in the unit responsible for the ex-post evaluation of competition policy and enforcement. He has over 20 years' experience in antitrust, merger control and state aid control. Previously, he has worked as a Director of an economic consultancy active in the field of competition economics (2014-2019) and as a member of the Chief Economist Team of DG Competition (2004-2014). In the period 2012-2014, he acted as Deputy Chief Economist, with special responsibility for State aid control. He is the author of numerous articles and publications on competition economics, and co-editor of the book publication "EU State Aid Control: Law and Economics" (Kluwer, 2017/2024). He holds a Ph.D. in

economics from Tilburg University.



Lluís SAURÍ

Lluís Saurí has been Acting Chief Economist at DG Competition, European Commission, since August 2023 and Head of Unit at the Chief Economist Team since May 2021. Lluís has a PhD in economics (European University Institute, 2012) and over 15 years of experience, both in the private and public sectors, in merger, antitrust and state aid control. He joined the Chief Economist Team in February 2015 where he was responsible for the economic analysis of the team in the fields of energy and environment. Frank has advised various international organizations, such as the European Commission, the OECD, national competition authorities as well as some leading companies on various cases.



Vanessa TURNER

Vanessa is Senior Advisor for Competition at the European Consumer Organisation, BEUC. Vanessa focusses on ensuring that consumer interests are taken into account in European competition policy, in particular in Digital Markets and Sustainability and in key merger, antitrust and DMA enforcement cases before the Commission and EU Courts. Lars-Hendrik RÖLLER

Lars-Hendrik Röller is professor of economics at ESMT Berlin, the European School of Management and Technology and the Chairman of the Berlin Global Dialogue. He is also director at E.CA Economics, an economic consultancy in competition policy, which he co-founded in 2006 and the Chairman of Blackrock's Transition Investing Advisory Council. From 2011-2021, he was Chief Economic Advisor to Chancellor Merkel. In this capacity he was responsible for the economic, financial and energy policy at the Chancellery. Previous positions include Europe's (first) Chief Competition Economist of the European Commission (2003-2006), President of the European School of

Management and Technology in Berlin (2006-2011), Professor at Humboldt University Berlin (1995-2011), Professor at INSEAD (France, 1987-1994), and Director at the WZB Berlin Social Science Center (1994-2003). Lars-Hendrik Röller holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Pennsylvania.



Maarten Pieter SCHINKEL

Maarten Pieter Schinkel is Professor of Competition Economics and Regulation at the University of Amsterdam and a research fellow of the Tinbergen Institute. His research interests are in industrial organization, competition policy and market regulation. His work has been published in leading academic journals and he (co-)authored several books. Schinkel previously held positions at Maastricht University, MIT, and the College of Europe. He occasionally acts as an expert on complex competition litigation matters and has served in several public functions, including as Non-Governmental Advisor to the

European Commission and Deputy Economic Counsel to the Board to the Dutch competition authority (ACM). He is currently a member of the Economic Advisory Group Competition Policy (EAGCP) at the European Commission.



Rupprecht PODSZUN

Prof. Dr. Rupprecht Podszun holds the Chair for Civil Law, German and European Competition Law at Heinrich Heine University Düsseldorf. He is a member of the German Monopolies Commission and the President of ASCOLA, the Academic Society for Competition Law. Currently, his research focus is on the twin transition. He is a Principal Investigator of the research project Shaping Competition in the Digital Age (www.scidaproject.com) and a co-author of the book "Competition and Sustainability" (Edward Elgar 2024). Rupprecht is also a guest professor at the Université Aix-Marseille.



Thomas DEISENHOFER

Since January 2021, Thomas Deisenhofer is Principal Adviser in DG Competition of the European Commission, responsible for economic ex post evaluation of competition enforcement and policy. Prior to that, from 2011 to 2020, he worked as Head of a merger control unit in DG Competition in charge of the control of mergers in basic industries, manufacturing and agriculture. In 2009 and 2010, he was Head of the merger unit responsible for telecommunications, media and IT. In the period 2005 to 2009, he was assistant of Philip Lowe, Director General of DG Competition, and responsible for state aid control. From 1998 to 2002 Thomas worked as a "référéndaire" (clerk) for Advocate General F.G. Jacobs at the European Court of Justice.
